

GC7G2JD Klimaschätze in Oldenburg-Donnerschwee

This is a multi-cache on the area of former „Donnerschwee barracks“.

Most of the military buildings were not been teared down but were rebuilt into apartments. Also new town houses were built so today more than 750 families can live here.

The QR-codes found at each station will lead you to an audio file, spoken in the old northern German language “Plattdeutsch”.

This is a shortened translation for non-German speaking Geocachers.

St. 1: Thomasblock

You are standing in front of the “Thomasblock”. It is built in 1880 and the oldest and nicest building belonging to the old barracks of “Oldenburg- Donnerschwee” and it is dedicated to the former grand duke of Oldenburg Peter-Friedrich Ludwig.

The name of the building changed several times within the last years. The last name it was given is “Thomasblock.” Thomas was the commander of british troops that took over the barracks after World War 2.

Today there are 81 modern energy efficient apartments inside.

Your task: Take a look at the entrance and watch out for the letter under the crown that remembers you of the grand duke Peter Friedrich Ludwig. Transform this letter into a number (A=1, B=2,...) and thereafter into the cross number. This is the 1st digit you need at the final box.

St .2: Fahrzeughallen (garage/car park)

The nearby building with many metal doors has been used as garages for military vehicles. Most of these vehicles were cars or smaller trucks. Larger vehicles, like tanks, have never been stationed here.

Today the former garages contain apartments, too. Some relicts, like cranes, tools for decoration purposes etc. can still be found inside.

Your task: How many metal gates can you see ? Count them and write down the cross sum. This is the 2nd number you need.

St. 3: Schumacherhof (Schumacher's court)

The large court you will find nearby is the central place, the "Schumacherhof".

The 4 same looking buildings surrounding it were built as offices and command centres between 1934 and 1937. You can still see white digits written on the walls of each building. The numbers were used for identification.

Your task: Add all 4 white numbers on the walls and take the cross sum. This is the 3rd digit you will need at the final cache.

St. 4: Elly-Hauenschild-Haus

On the eastern part of the area, two foundations, the Dammermann-Hauenschild-Foundation and the Eriksen-Grensing-Foundation built 78 modern social apartments, that confirm highest ecological standards.

The Elly Hauenschild-Haus is a part of this project. Many generations live there building a community and try to support each other as far as possible.

Your task: Find the year the building was built. Calculate the cross sum of all 4 digits and write down this as your 4th and last number.

Final:

Behind the outer door you will find a 'Room Escape game' with 6 tasks. Come in and try to open the safe! You may touch everything but must not change anything. Please restore everything in place.

All quests and tasks are logical and can be solved without any tools or ciphers.

The only thing you need is some basic knowledge of the writing of German numbers (e.g. "sechzehn" means "16"). No idea? You will find them on the last page!

And maybe it is useful to know, that "left" is called "links" in German. Tell someone "schaue rechts" if you want him to watch "right" "runter" for "down" and "hoch" for "up".

You are looking for 6 different numbers: 1U, 2V, 3W, 4X, 5Y, 6Z. Sort them beginning with the smallest, ending with the largest numbers (like "12, 25, 33, 49, 50, 64"), . The combination for the safe is "UVWXYZ" [E].

This is not the letter “F”!

Final:

Hint 1: Something seems to be lost...

Hint 2: Look close!

Hint 3: There seems something to be added

Hint 4: Move or think!

Hint 5: Take a picture; it is easier to count

Hint 6: There is also missing something from the beginning to the end
